

Absences and Fines

Dear Parents/Carers,

Attendance is an important area that we take seriously at Manor Park Academy. As you are aware the government has implemented attendance fines to encourage consistent attendance and to emphasise the importance of regular school attendance. These fines are imposed when a child's attendance falls below 10 sessions missed or absence without authorised leave. While our aim is not to penalise families, it is important to be aware of the potential consequences of continued non-compliance with attendance policies.

We have 6 parents from 3 families that have been taken through the legal process related to attendance and have been sent fines.

Regular school attendance is of the greatest importance for your child's academic progress and overall development. Attending school every day ensures that your child receives the necessary education, engages in valuable interactions with staff and their class, and establishes good habits for their future. We understand that there may be circumstances beyond your control that can lead to absences. In such cases, it is vital that you inform the school in advance and provide necessary documentation and ongoing communication around any absences.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and your continued co-operation. Together, we can ensure the best possible educational experience for your child.

It also acknowledges the unique contribution of the Windrush Generation, 75 years after their arrival in the UK, and honours those who served in the Battle of the Atlantic 80 years ago.





Our team will be happy to help you see if you are eligible for the course. However, you must meet these requirments to do the course:

- Learners have to be aged 19 +
- Have a good level of both speaking and writing in English
- Not studied an IT qualification beforehand


