

Dear Families

It was great to see the children developing and honing their wheelchair basketball skills during PE lessons this week. They also got the opportunity to meet with Paralympic GB women's wheelchair basketball player Siobhan Fitzpatrick, who was also an ambassador for Birmingham Commonwealth Games!

On Friday, we were pleased to welcome Gavin Roberts, Chair of the REAch2 Trust, into school to see the school in action. The children in Year 3 created a wonderful card for him and he enjoyed hearing from our children leaders in school about what makes Manor Park a special place to be.

Please look out for information sent out recently about Year 4's Multiplication Times Table Check Information Meeting for parents/carers, our Parent Governor Nominations, Parents' Evenings and flu vaccinations. If you have not received this information, please ask at the office for a copy of parents' evening and flu vaccination forms, and always keep us up to date with your contact details.

On Monday, I was delighted with the three classes who had 100% attendance and the other three classes who were only 1 absence away from being 100%! School attendance is essential. Going to school is directly linked to improved exam performance which should in turn lead to further learning opportunities and better job prospects. As well as this, going to school helps to develop friendships! We ask that parents make appointments outside of school hours, but, if your child does have to go during the school day, always bring them to school beforehand and bring them back afterwards.

Next week, we are looking forward to welcoming Beginning Teachers into school to start their training to become teachers of the future. They will be joining classes in Year 2 and Year 3. It will also be the last week that our amazing site manager, Frank Gaffney, will be in school. He is moving on to a new career opportunity and we wish him all the best for the future.

We ask that parents waiting to collect children from Years 1, 2 and 3 at hometime, please stand well back to avoid crowding. Teachers need to bring their children down from the upper level of the building into the playground and dismiss them safely, so please be patient when this may take longer than usual. Our

teaching staff always have the safety of the children at the heart of everything that they do and we appreciate your understanding. We are planning to add markings to the KS1 playground so that parents and carers can see more clearly where to wait at a safe distance.

Important Information about Flu Vaccinations



You should have received a consent form for your child to receive their annual flu vaccine. Please note that this is not an injection - it is a quick nasal spray and administered by a qualified medical practitioner.

Please read the information carefully on the form and complete it fully. We need all forms back to school as quickly as possible so that the NHS Immunisation Team can prepare enough vaccines for all of the children before they visit the school.




