





The BCS Entry 3 & Level 1 Essential Digital Skills for Work qualification has been created to help you learn the basics of using computers, smartphones and tablets.

As well as this, specific basic skills will be covered such as turning on a device including entering and updating any account information safely, using the mouse and keyboard for a computer or touchscreen on a smartphone or tablet and connecting to the internet (including Wi-Fi) safely and securely before opening a browser.

Our team will be happy to help you see if you are eligible for the course. However, you must meet these requirments to do the course:

- Learners have to be aged 19 +
- Have a good level of both speaking and writing in English
- Not studied an IT qualification beforehand


